The theme for Nursery this term has been Come Outside, and we have been outside a lot, in all weathers, rain or shine, wind or drizzle! The mud kitchen has been developed and children are loving mixing up potions, adding their own special ingredients and generally making a lovely muddy mess! We have been on a nature walk to find signs of spring and collect some sticks for our Mud Kitchen. We grew some cress from seeds. We cut it up and ate our cress with bread and butter, it was delicious.

All children have been building their fine motor skills and working really hard on their listening and attention, playing lots of listening games to identify various sounds. We have loved using masks to act out our stories and rhymes each week.

We explored collage this term and used Kadinsky as our inspiration. Next term we are looking forward to our theme of 'Out Of This World, exploring up in space and under the sea.'

Reception have really enjoyed learning about our topic of Growing in this second half of the Spring Term. We have been learning all about plants and what they need to grow and how we can care for them. The children have been growing bean seeds in cotton wool and water in clear bags on our windows, so that we could see the roots and the shoots emerge from the bean seed. We have also been planting seeds in soil, which we will soon be sending home so the children can continue to use all the skills they have learnt to support their young plants to grow. However, our favourite growing project has been the frogspawn! We have been able to watch our frogspawn change into tadpoles and we have created special frog booklets to record all the important stages in the life-cycle of a frog. We have released the tadpoles back into the pond in the environmental area so we don't return after Easter to a classroom full of baby frogs hopping about the place!

This term we have been learning about how to keep our minds and bodies healthy by eating and drinking the right foods and getting plenty of rest. We also enjoyed joining Key Stage 1 for special activities on keeping safe in an emergency, road safety and stranger safety. We also joined them for Wellbeing Wednesday, when we tried different activities to help us relax. Learning these skills will help at times when we might feel worried or overwhelmed by how we are feeling. The children have also learn rainbow breathing so please ask them to teach you this to help you to relax too! World Book Day and our Tiger Who Came To Breakfast morning were also two of our highlights from this half-term.

The children have continued to make great progress with working with numbers to 10 and knowing which smaller numbers combine together to make bigger numbers. We have also been learning about doubles and 3D shapes so please help your child spot 3D shapes and doubles in their home environment .Reception continue to work hard on developing their reading and writing skills. Please help your child by reading with them at home and encouraging them to write short sentences whenever the opportunity presents itself! We hope you all have a lovely Easter break and enjoy the holidays. We also wish all our Muslim families Eid Mubarak for the Eid celebrations during this holiday.

As always, we have been working very hard in Year 3 and our efforts are really showing in our work. I'd like to take this opportunity to say a big 'well done' to all of Year 3 for working so hard this week to complete their assessments. It's never easy, but you have done so well. In History, we have continued our work on Prehistory, learning all about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. We became history detectives, using evidence found to come up with our own theories as to what life was like during these times and comparing them to our life now. We also looked at how the Stone Age people expressed themselves through art on their cave walls. We had the chance to be Prehistoric artists as well. We created our own cave paintings (although on paper, not cave walls) using oil pastels and chalks. We had a great time doing these and were very creative drawing the animals and people, similar to those found from thousands of years ago.

We continued the Stone Age theme in our English work, when we wrote our own version of 'The Stone Age Boy'. Using all our knowledge from our history lessons, we wrote a story about finding ourselves in the Stone Age and experiencing life as it was then. Some great stories were written, well done everyone. We have also just finished a unit on poetry and wrote some amazing poems called 'I asked a little boy who cannot see', where we had to describe what colour was like. We also had great fun on World Book Day, dressing up and participating in Round Robin activities in our Houses teams.

In maths, we are currently learning all about mass and capacity having completed our work on fractions. We will continue mass and capacity after Easter. If you get the opportunity to do some baking or cooking together, this would be a great opportunity for practical application of weighing and measuring.

We finished our unit of work on 'Rocks and Soil' in science, looking at different types of rocks, identifying their properties and uses, comparing different soils and finding out how fossils are created. We are now ready to start our new unit of 'Plants' next term. We enjoyed our Round Robin activities for Science Week, were we learnt about our brains and animal lifecycles. In PE this term we have been developing our teamwork in Outdoor and Adventurous Activities (OAA) unit. We have played games, solved problems and worked together, very effectively, as a team. Well done Year 3.

This half term has seen some rather interesting scenes taking place in the Year 4 classroom, including a plague victim shivering in the corner and an exploration of old-fashioned remedies, as we explored play scripts in our English sessions. It was strange to write dialogue without constantly being told to 'check the inverted commas are in the correct place'! We became very skilled at writing stage directions inside parentheses (brackets) and completed the unit by writing our own playscript about what happened next in the village of Eyam.

Within Maths, we developed our understanding of fractions and decimals, which we shall continue to explore after Easter. As Ms Batten and Miss Daley continue to remind the whole class, the Year 4 times table check takes place in the summer term, so please practise your times tables at home. You can also log on to Times Table Rockstars to further improve your speed and accuracy.

Having completed our work on 'Sound', Year 4 have embraced the Science unit 'Electricity' with much enthusiasm; constructing, improving and fixing circuits, exploring switches as well as insulators and conductors, before the final challenge of making a working torch. After the Easter break, we will be looking at Animals, including humans.

We enjoyed the Round Robin activities of World Book Day and Science week, as well as the chance for some of the children to carry out science-based tasks with their parents; our thanks to Mrs Dalton for organising this. If ever you want some science activities to do at home, ask Miss Daley.

Over the last few weeks, we have been finding out about our Artist of the Half Term, Yayoi Kusama. She covers everything in dots! We have also learnt about Andy Goldsworthy's land art and have tried to produce our own. The land art was linked to our Geography work, where we have discovered interesting facts about earthquakes, flooding and volcanoes. Next term, the children begin their swimming lessons. Miss Daley, Mrs Liggins and Mrs Beaulah will be with them at the pool, but if you have any concerns or queries, please do speak to one of us. 


Oak Class - Mrs Dunton and Miss Adams

Over the course of this term, we have been building knowledge about World War II through our history, geography, reading and writing lessons. This has allowed the children to further secure key information relating to the events but also the impact it had on people in the UK and around the world. The writing lessons have been focused on two pieces of texts, the first was 'The Journey', this was about the lives of a family who had to leave their home as refugees. The second text was called 'Letters from the Lighthouse'; this text explored the lives of children being evacuated from London to Devon. The class were able to make comparisons between these books as well as our class novel 'Goodnight Mr Tom.' As we come to the end of this term, we have now completed our Mastery Milestone lesson. This is the opportunity to demonstrate how much they have learnt about World War II in the form of a double page spread. The children have also had the opportunity to do this for our science learning about Evolution and Inheritance. The science lessons this term have sparked some interesting debate about the future of human evolution.

We continue to work steadily through the maths units, this term we have covered fractions, decimals, percentages, area, perimeter as well as statistics and reinforcing this through the home learning and though additional maths lessons.

It has been great fun to have World Book Day and Science Day as well this term, the children are also working on being role models in their positions as Mind Mentors and Reading Mentors. We look forward to all that comes with the Summer Term.

Mental Health Ambassadors



18 of our Year 5 and Year 6 children have been trained by Huw from Buckinghamshire Mind to be mental health ambassadors. This means they are available during lunchtime for our pupils to talk to if they need it. Mrs Dalton, our Family Support Worker, works closely with the group and helps with the work schedule. The sessions have been well attended and Huw commented on how knowledgeable our children were during their training.

Attendance Matters

Your child's attendance at school is very important. If your child misses a day or two, they miss a sequence of learning which can lead to them having mis-understandings. It is difficult for children to 'catch-up' on their missed learning. At the moment, our school attendance is 92%. Good attendance is over 95%. Any leave taken outside of school holidays is unauthorised and teachers will not set work for missed learning. You must complete a 'Leave of Absence form' (available from the school office and our website) to inform us of your child's whereabouts. All attendance matters are referred to Buckinghamshire County Council for monitoring and any issuing of fixed penalties. Those families with poor attendance will receive letters from the school advising them of our monitoring after half-term. Some families will be contacted by Buckinghamshire Council to attend Parent Contract Meetings (PCMs) to discuss the lack of improvement in attendance over the last two terms.

If your child is unwell, it is your responsibility to contact the school office via phone call by 9.15am to inform us.

Wild About Well-Being

Over the last six weeks we have been lucky enough to have a group of adults from Buckinghamshire Mental Health Team working with some of our Year 6 pupils in a group called, Wild About Well-Being. Despite the terrible weather, they have all had the best time making shelters, having toasted marshmallows and using their imagination to have fun.
