Week 2 – lesson 3 – Fractions of a set of objects (2). This learning on fractions builds on our learning so far. We are now learning how to find fractions of amount greater than $\frac{1}{5}$, so maybe 2/5 or $\frac{3}{4}$.

To do this you divide the amount by the bottom number (denominator) of the fraction, then multiply by the top number.

For example: ³/₄ of 20.

- 1) Divide 20 by 4 = 5
- 2) 5 x 3 (top number of fraction) = 15

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¾ of 20 = 15
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Another example: 6 /10 of 50

- 1) Divide 50 by 10 = 5
- 2) 5 x 6 (top number of fraction) = 30

6/10 of 50 = 30

I hope the examples help you. Now complete the worksheet as best as you can.
