
There are four suggested activities if you follow the link below. You don't need to do all of them – pick the ones you like.

Today we are learning about equivalent fractions and this fraction wall may help to show those that are equivalent. Equivalent means the same or equal.

Fractions Wall



Parents, the worksheet asks the children to shade fractions that are the same. Without printing the sheet out, you can discuss with your child how many they would shade. Please practise saying the sentences together such as one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) is the same as two quarters ($\frac{2}{4}$).
