I have downloaded the activity sheets and answer sheets for you, so they should be attached to the email you receive, however if that doesn't work you can also download them from our school website, or straight from the White Rose website via the link above.

1. Monday - rounding decimals
2. Tuesday - halves and quarters
3. Wednesday - pounds and pence
4. Thursday - ordering money
5. Friday - surprise challenge!

Remember for Monday's lesson our success criteria for rounding:

1. Underline the number you are rounding to
2. Find the 'bossy number' (next place value down)
3. The bossy number tells you what to do: 0 - 4 stick to the floor, 5 - 9 up to the sky
4. The bossy number changes the number you are rounding to
5. After you have rounded, the bossy number and all those after it (in lower place values) lose their power and become place holders.

As well as these steps, remember to keep the decimal point in the same place, this doesn't move, it is the numbers themselves that will change as you round them.

Remember, an integer is a whole number - not a fraction.

Remember you can access all this on a computer or tablet or phone, and also on your tv via the Red Button option.

Monday's work is all about identifying and using prepositions. Prepositions tell you where a noun (a person, place or thing) is in relation to something else. For example, under, over, behind, in front of, etc. Prepositions can also relate to time, and tell you when something happened, eg before or after.

Watch the clips on the BBC Bitesize website, then have a go at the activities. There is an activity sheet to complete which I have downloaded for you already. If you want to (you don't have to) there is an extra challenge of writing 5 sentences about things you can see around you in the room (or garden, if you like!), and for you to use 5 different prepositions in these sentences. There is a support sheet I have downloaded for you as well, which gives you lots of examples of prepositions that you could use.
