Today for English please look at Tuesday's lesson: Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> May. This lesson is all about how we use fronted adverbials to make our sentences interesting! Fronted adverbials are extra pieces of information (a word or a phrase) that you put at the start of your sentence and separate from the main clause with a comma.
